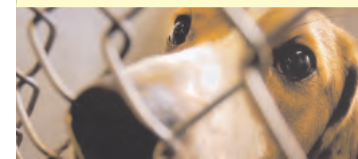

American Humane's Professional Member Agencies are eligible for unique funding opportunities that help the agencies – and the animals in their care. Among our grant programs are two highly popular efforts:

Second Chance® Fund Grant

American Humane provides financial assistance to American Humane Professional Member Agencies to help offset the cost of medical care for animals who have been abused or neglected. We help agencies, so that animals can recover and be adopted into permanent, loving homes.



"Aurora" is one benefactor of American Humane's Second Chance Fund. The young shih tzu was found trapped in a plastic bag and brought to a shelter. Under her matted fur, doctors found an

injury to her leg and a crushed paw. The Second Chance Fund helped the agency pay for her treatment. Today, this tiny dog has found a new home and a new family.

Meacham Foundation Memorial Grant

Established in 1969 in memory of Tressa Meacham, this grant provides financial assistance to American Humane Professional Member Agencies to enhance or improve the quality of care given to animals. Through the years, shelters have used funds from the Meacham Foundation Memorial Grant to build or expand housing for animals, invest in equipment and supplies, enrich animals' environments and launch capital campaigns.
